



# CHÂTEAU LANGLET

## White 2019

Graves Appellation  
Grand Vin de Bordeaux

### PRESENTATION OF THE ESTATE

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Situated in the commune of Cabanac-et-Villagrains, in the township of La Brède, the Château Langlet is one of the most ancient wines of the region. It is listed for its red and white wine production in the 1868 edition of “Bordeaux and its Wines”, published by Féret Editions.

The vineyard is spread over a hill of deep gravel, with a magnificent position. It has been in the Jean Kressmann family since 1999, which has enforced a traditional winegrowing and winemaking culture in order to obtain the best from this exceptional terroir.

### THE VINEYARD

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<b>Surface of production for white:</b>	1.5 ha (total surface: 8.6 ha)
<b>Nature of the soil:</b>	Small gravelly soil from the Tertiary period with clay and sand subsoils
<b>Grape varieties:</b>	100% Sauvignon Blanc
<b>Pruning:</b>	Double Guyot
<b>Density of planting:</b>	5,500 feet/ha
<b>Average age of the vineyard:</b>	5 years
<b>Management of the vineyard:</b>	Traditional methods. Sustainable Vine Protection. Green harvesting by hand: desuckering, excess bud removal, leaf thinning, removal of excess shoots.

#### Harvest:

Handpicking in small crates

Sauvignon Blanc: the 9<sup>th</sup> of September

#### Vinification:

Alcoholic fermentation in barrels

Ageing: 6 months in French oak barrels

New barrels: 10%

Alcohol: 13.5%



### TASTING

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<b>Blending:</b>	100% Sauvignon Blanc
<b>Bottling:</b>	At the Château, in April 2020 – 9,500 bottles
<b>Distribution:</b>	Place de Bordeaux

« Château Langlet 2019 is pale yellow. The nose is aromatic and very expressive, even explosive, with exuberant notes of citrus fruit and peach. The attack is soft and round. The mouth is fruity, again with notes of peach. The finish is fresh, marked by a slight hint of acidity (citrus zest).»
