



## INTRODUCTION TO THE ESTATE

Situated in the village of Cabanac-et-Villagrains, in the township of La Brède, the Château Langlet is one of the most ancient wines of the region. It is listed for its red and white wine production in the 1868 edition of "Bordeaux and its Wines", published by the Féret editions.

The vineyard is spread over a hill of deep gravel, with a magnificent position. It has been in the Jean Kressmann family since 1999, which has enforced a traditional winegrowing and winemaking culture in order to obtain the best from this exceptional terrain. The winery has obtained High Environmental Value (HEV) certification in 2019.

## THE VINEYARD

- *Production area* 1.46 Ha for the white (total surface : 10.61 Ha)
- *Nature of the soil* Small gravelly soil from the Tertiary period, with clay and sand subsoils
- *Grape varieties* 100% Sauvignon Blanc
- *Pruning* Double Guyot
- *Planting density* 5500 feet/ Ha
- *Average age of the vines* 15 years old
- *Vineyard management* Traditional sustainable farming methods, with mechanical soil maintenance. The work on the growing vines is carried out manually (pruning, excess buds, shoots and leaves removal).

### Harvest

- Handpicking in small crates
- Sauvignon Blanc: September 5

### Vinification

- Alcoholic fermentation in stainless steel vats
- Ageing: 6 months on lees
- Alcohol: 12.5%



## THE TASTING

- *Blending* 100% Sauvignon Blanc
- *Bottling* At the Château, in February 2025 – 18,900 bottles
- *Distribution* Place de Bordeaux

This wine has a brilliant and clear pale yellow with light green tints. The nose is expressive, marked by intense aromas of exotic fruits (passion fruit, kiwi) combined with subtle floral notes (immortelle flower). The attack in the mouth is rich and lively, with a complex aromatic palette dominated by papaya and mango. The palate is fresh and ethereal. The finish is very long with a mineral dimension.
